Subject Area:

Social sciences and humanities.

Applicants are advised to review <u>Imagining Canada's Future</u>'s 16 future global challenges and to consider addressing one or more of these areas in their research proposal.

Intended to:

- Provide support over one to three years to teams/partnerships, led by a project director, to:
 - develop research and/or related activities in the social sciences and humanities, including <u>knowledge mobilization</u> and the meaningful <u>involvement of students</u> and <u>emerging scholars</u>, by fostering new partnerships with existing and/or potential partners; or
 - design and test <u>new partnership approaches</u> for research and/or related activities that may result in <u>best practices or models</u> that either can be adapted by others or have the potential to be <u>scaled up</u> to a regional, national or international level.

Conditions:

- Applications may be submitted by an individual researcher or a team of researchers. Coapplicants can be affiliated with an eligible Canadian postsecondary institution, not-forprofit organization, philanthropic foundation, think tank, or municipal, territorial or provincial government OR an international postsecondary institution.
- Teams must be working in <u>formal partnership</u> between postsecondary institutions and/or partner organizations (Canadian or international institutions or public, private or not-forprofit organizations).
- Partnerships can be <u>existing or new</u>, including_disciplinary and interdisciplinary research partnerships, cross-sector knowledge co-creation, research networks or partnered knowledge mobilization.
- Proposals must include <u>training</u>, <u>mentoring</u> and <u>employability plans</u> for students and <u>emerging scholars</u>.
- Applicants and co-applicants from eligible not-for-profit organizations may request a salary research allowance.
- Course release is NOT an eligible expense.
- SSHRC and its partner organizations offer joint initiatives that complement this funding opportunity.

Value: \$75,000 to \$200,000 for one to three years

Partner's Contribution: Cash and/or in-kind contributions are expected

Sheridan's Contribution: Not required
