Connect Grants

Subject Area:

Across the spectrum of natural and social sciences, engineering, humanities or health.

Intended to:

- <u>Level 1 Connect Grants</u> provide support for travel, accommodation, meals and meeting
 costs within Canada to college researchers and research administrators for outreach
 aimed at forming new partnerships with Canadian companies.
- <u>Level 2 Connect Grants</u> provide support for: 1) research planning and networking
 activities within Canada to develop new college—industry partnerships; 2) activities or
 promotional tools to encourage new partnerships supported by CCI Program grants.

Conditions:

- Individuals are limited to two Level 1 Connect Grants per fiscal year.
- Approved funding must be used within three months following the award start date (Level 1 Connect grants) or within 12 months following the award start date (Level 2 Connect grants).
- For Level 2 grants, potential applicants must discuss their proposed activities with NSERC Regional Office staff before applying.
- For activities that aim to build research partnerships with an industrial Partner, Partners must operate from a Canadian base, have been incorporated for a minimum of two years, and have a minimum of two full-time employees.

Value: Level 1: Up to \$5,000

Level 2: Typically: up to \$5,000 - Exceptionally: up to \$25,000

Company Contribution: Not required Sheridan's Contribution: Not required

Application Deadline: No deadline. Requests of \$5,000 or less must be submitted at least **four weeks** before the proposed activity. Requests exceeding \$5,000 must be submitted at least **12 weeks** before the proposed activity.

Notification of Award Decision: 2-4 weeks

How to Apply: This is an institutional grant. Applications will be made by the Sheridan Research Office on behalf of the Principal Investigator. To begin the application process, please download the Expression of Interest Form (for Faculty Researchers) or Grant Application Summary Form (for Research Centres) from Sheridan Central, or email research@sheridancollege.ca to discuss your research idea.
